With a peak 693 m above sea level, Mt. Aoba offers a thrilling climb, with sections featuring chains to help climbers. Maizuru side of the mountain is popular as well, for climbers interested in taking on both sides. The mountain offers something for everyone, with walking and bicycling paths along the coast as well.

## Nakayama-dera Temple Located partway up Mt. Aoba, this temple's main gate offers an

incredible view of the Takahama coastline. The hondo main hall and the statue of Kongo Rikishi are nationally designated as important cultural properties.



# Magoji Temple

The principal deity of the temple, a wooden statue of the seated Bato Kannon, is nationally designated as an important cultural property. The path to the temple is also beautiful, with cherry blossoms, autumn colors, fresh spring greenery, and more.

Takahama is home to plenty of sporting events, including local beach rugby and lifesaving competitions held on the town's beautiful beaches.






# Wakasa Fugu Blowfish (Tiger Blowfish)

# Wakasa Seafood

Wakasa Tilefish (Aug. to Oct.), mackerel (Mar. to Dec.), halfbeak (Apr. to Aug.), and squid (spear squid from winter through spring, red squid from spring through summer, oval squid from summer through fall, and more). Dried seafood made from fresh catches is a great way to enjoy the flavors of Wakasa at home, too.
